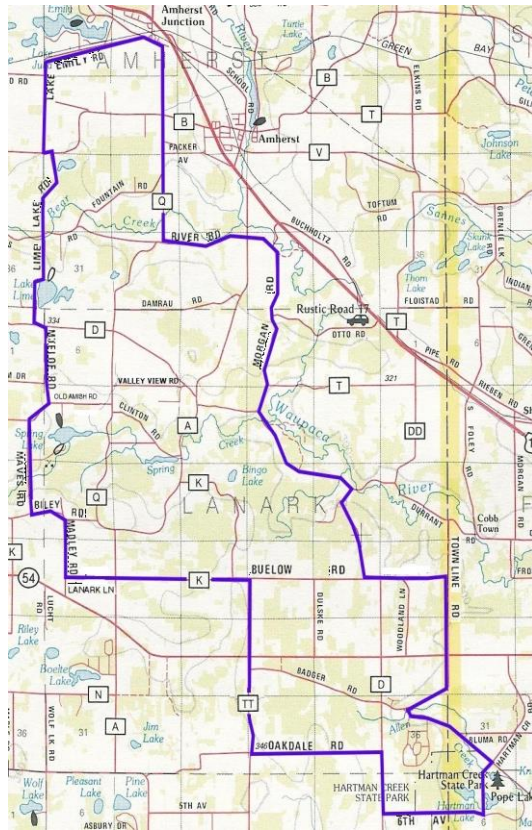


**LAKE EMILY COUNTY PARK

LOOP - 32 MILES**



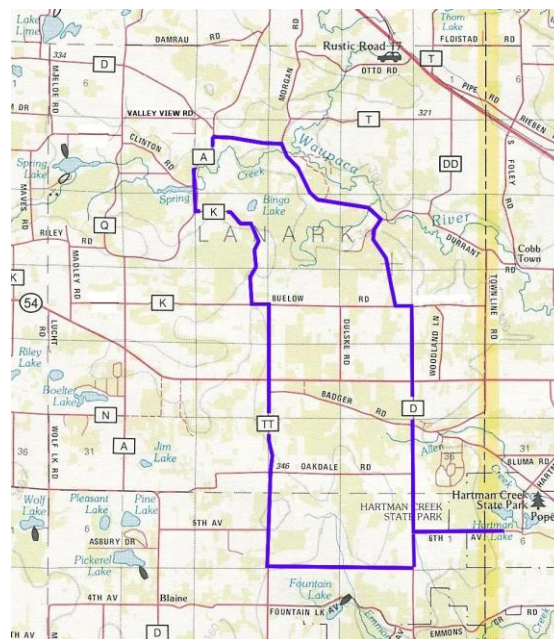
The routes pass through scenic areas of flatlands representing outwash plains formed as the glacier retreated, undulating land called ground moraines that was formed as rocks and debris suspended within the ice was deposited, and kettles and kames which are depressions and cone-shaped hills.

LOOP - 16 MILES**

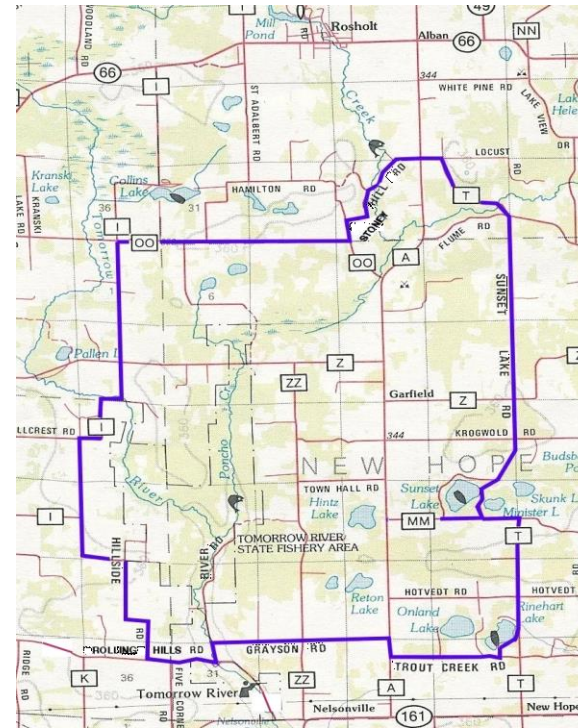
This signed route goes from Camp Helen Brachman on Asbury Dr. to Hartman Creek State Park and back.

LOOP - 17 MILES**

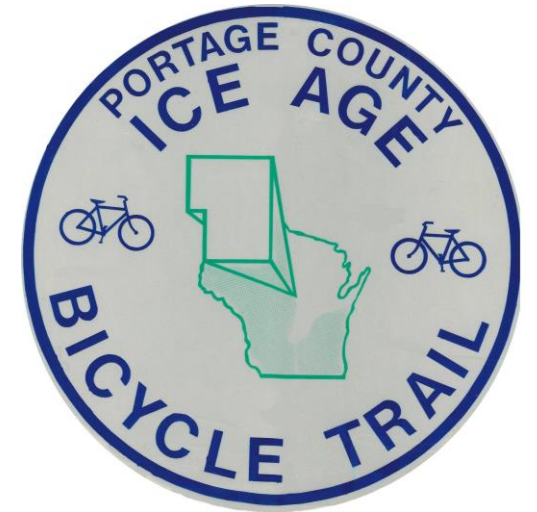


**SUNSET COUNTY PARK
